Dear Mr. Mauer:

I am writing to update the Seymour Valley Community Association regarding activity in the North Vancouver Cemetery landfill area.

Activity in the landfill has dropped off over the past month to the point machinery may be operating as little as four hours a day. Construction activities will increase again in February but as noted previously this will only be landfill work toward the development of the cemetery.

As you know the rock crushing has been eliminated and no gravel making has occurred since May. Over the course of the landfill procedure the sorting of blacktop, concrete and excavation material has resulted in stockpiles that equate to \$90,000 worth of gravel. It is important to recycle this material off the site rather than pushing it into the landfill.

The City of North Vancouver plans to contract Custom Loading to make gravel with the stockpiles from December 2, 2003 to December 15, 2003. The work hours will be between 8:00am to 5:00pm on weekdays only. This is the contractor the City used in May and the same contractor the District uses on the Lynn Creek side of the cemetery property.

I would like to say again the City recognizes the merit of the observations regarding noise from the site and will continue to operate in as unobtrusive a manner as possible.
